

To coincide with the opening of David Hockney. The Arrival of Spring, Normandy, 2020 at the Royal Academy in London this week, we have put together a list of books on the art of David Hockney.

Hockney has never stood still. For over sixty years he has been exploring new subjects and new techniques.

The sixteen books presented here cover his many different artistic periods—the early prints and drawings, the Paper Pool series, the swimming pools and California sunshine, the photo-collages, the return to Yorkshire and plein air painting and the iPad drawings.









An illustrated record of the Paper Pools series of artworks created by Hockney in 1978. The twenty-nine Paper Pool works were made using the paper pulp process, a mix of printmaking and painting, and a new medium for the artist. The images focus on the play of water and light, whilst also recognising the Californian sunshine that Hockney sought. Reproductions of the twenty-nine works are accompanied by preparatory line drawings, polaroids and a text 'Making Paper Pools' by the artist.





Between March 1981 and June 1983 David Hockney spent all of his creative energy experimenting with photography. He took thousands of photos and created more than 350 photocollages. This book is an extensively illustrated survey of these creations. The subjects are typical Hockney and range from pools, palms, still-lifes, landscapes and portraits. Sitters include Stephen Spender, Christopher Isherwood, Billy Wilder and Bill Brandt. The text, entitled *True to Life*, written by the New Yorker art critic Lawrence Weschler, brings the artists' thoughts and ideas to sparkling life.



A special edition of Vogue with a cover and 41 page contribution by David Hockney. Each year *Paris* Vogue chooses one creator from the world of the visual and performing arts to edit a portion of a single issue of the fabled fashion magazine. In 1985 David Hockney was selected, and this issue contains a fortyone page feature written and illustrated by him and featuring his own artwork and handwritten text. The pages reflect the artist's interests during this period; Hockney writes about perspective and illustrates it with his photo-collages and perspective-shifting paintings and drawings.









After decades in America, Hockney moved back to Bridlington, East Yorkshire at the beginning of the twentieth century. There followed some of the most fruitful years of his artistic career, capturing the local landscape in all it's many seasonal guises. In two conversations with Marco Livingstone, Hockney discusses his paintings, photographs and digital image making and his responses to the Yorkshire topography.



Published to accompany the exhibition of the same name first shown at the Royal Academy in London. At the turn of the century Hockney returned to live in his native Yorkshire and in the pursuing decade painted en plein air the landscape of his youth. The fruits of these prolific years are bought together in David Hockney: A Bigger Picture, with images that combine the traditions of landscape painting with Hockney's own colourful and forward-looking eye. Paintings, charcoal drawings, iPad drawings and video stills are all generously illustrated. The essays discuss this new work and place it in the context of his sixty-year career.








