
JOHN PIPER



John Piper was an exceptional artist, producing work in a variety of media, including paintings, prints, book illustrations, photographs, stained glass, graphics, tapestries, stage designs and magazines. He and his wife Myfanwy stood at the centre of British cultural life during the mid-twentieth century.

John Piper is a short list of 16 books on the life and work of the artist. The books cover all aspects of Piper's output and together trace his entire career. As always, there are some old favourites and some new discoveries.









A commemorative volume of the production of 'The Rape of Lucretia' at Glyndebourne, with designs by John Piper. Benjamin Britten's opera was performed at Glyndebourne in 1946 to enormous acclaim. The book includes a foreword by Britten, the complete text of Ronald Duncan's Libretto, and an essay by Piper on his stage and costume designs. Some of the original designs are finely reproduced, alongside photographs of the original production.



Piper produced an original aquatint 'Figures from a Seal' and four lithographs specifically for the book. The lithographs were drawn in Paris and printed by Mourlot.













Piper used photographs as a source of inspiration for his paintings, but also directly in publications such as the *Shell County Guides* and *Architectural Review*. The images capture the British landscapes and its buildings.





At the rear are lists of portfolios, printers, illustrations, exhibitions, designs for theatre, stained glass and tapestries, and writings by the artist. The book is based on Levinson's earlier catalogue from 1987 but includes prints made between 1987 and Piper's death in 1992, as well as newly discovered earlier prints.



Piper was one of the greatest designers of stained glass in the twentieth century. His work includes windows at Coventry Cathedral, Eton College and Liverpool Cathedral. Osborne's comprehensive study examines Piper's designs, the traditions and techniques he followed, and his collaboration with the master craftsmen who realised his artworks. The author collaborated with Myfanwy Piper and had access to the artist's studio. The book includes a full catalogue of Piper's stained glass work.




John Piper in the 1930s. Abstraction on the Beach


